Work Periods and Hours

Interns will be provided office space at the Endowment's headquarters in Greenville, South Carolina. Office hours are flexible, but the Intern will be expected to work 40 hours per week on a set schedule.

Compensation for Services

Interns are considered independent contractors and are paid a monthly stipend of \$2,300 contingent on meeting the required works hours. As an independent contractor, the intern is responsible for all relevant employment taxes on the stipend. Interns are not eligible for benefits, but are provided a full slate of paid holidays. Participation in the Endowment Internship Program does not in any way imply a promise of future employment.
