

HEALTHY WATERSHEDS CONSORTIUM GRANT PROGRAM

The <u>Healthy Watersheds Consortium Grant Program</u> (HWC) was conceived by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), managed by the Endowment, and funded by these two and the USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS).

HWC, launched in 2015 and completed in 2022, promotes the protection and stewardship of high-quality watersheds in support of the EPA's Clean Water Act 303(d) Vision to prevent future impairments in healthy waters. The watersheds covered by the HWC have many of their services and systems intact; however, protecting them from degradation lessens the need for state or local future regulation and costly restoration expenses.

USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service A total of 56 grants enabled local partners across approximately 30 states and 9 EPA regions to implement watershed protection plans, build the organizational and social infrastructure needed for long-term protection efforts, and advance watershed practices. The average grant size was approximately \$180K.
