Through a partnership with mano-Y-ola and with funding from the Endowment, the U.S. Forest Service, and the Natural Resources Conservation Service, the Hispanic Forest Landowner Outreach Program (HFLO) was established to provide technical assistance to Hispanic forest landowners in the U.S.

- Maintaining forest land as an asset for individuals, families, and communities
- Fostering sustainable forest management practices
- Connecting historically marginalized landowners to federal resources and support
